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Definitions

Honors: A class for students who are capable of working independently and above grade level peers.

Level I: A college-prep class for students who are working independently at grade level.

Level II: A class for students who require more teacher-directed support to work at grade level.

Dual-Enrollment (DE): A college course that is taught at Bangor High School. Students receive university and high school credit.

Advanced Placement (AP): A *CollegeBoard* course that is typically the most advanced high school course in a particular subject area. Students can earn college credit by passing a standardized exam at the end of the year.

Academy: Bangor HS has four academies where students can concentrate their electives in an area of strength and interest. The academies begin with a foundational course in Grade 9 and end with a major capstone in Grade 12. The academies include; STEM, Business, Fine Arts, and the Humanities.
